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Efficacy of Homoeopathy in Pyelonephritis

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ABSTRACT:

Pyelonephritis is a common renal disease and it is defined as an infection of the kidney, affecting the tubules, interstitial and renal pelvis. History and physical examination are the most useful tools for diagnosis. Most patients have fever, although it may be absent early in the illness. Flank pain is nearly universal, and its absence should raise suspicion of an alternative diagnosis. A positive urinalysis confirms the diagnosis in patients with a compatible history and physical examination. Urine culture should be obtained in all patients. If infection does not resolve, scarring of the kidney may take place resulting in potential organ damage or life-threatening condition. Each infection may lead to significant damage to the kidney, kidney failure, abscess formation, sepsis, shock or multi-organ system failure.

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
