Full Mouth Rehabilitation of Worn-Out Teeth Using Hobo's Twin Stage Philosophy: A Case Report

Abstract:

The ultimate goal of full mouth rehabilitation is to restore normal oral cavity function, health and esthetics of the patient. Various philosophies have been described in the prosthodontic literature to restore lost occlusion and dental esthetics due to teeth wear. Hobo Twin Stage philosophy is one such concept advocated to treat the mutilated dentition. According to this concept, the posterior and anterior teeth are restored using specific values of standard cusp angles. This case report utilises Hobo's twin stage technique to reconstruct the lost tooth structure within 6 treatment phases.
