## Abstract

Undernutrition is a condition in which there is inadequate consumption, poor absorption or excessive loss of nutrients. Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) scheme is the largest national programme for the promotion of the mother and child health and their development in the world. After 47 years of ICDS, 36% of under-five children in India as NFHS 5 are underweight, 35.5% stunted, and 19.3% wasted. Ayurveda nutraceuticals and its substitution in these arenas are still not explored.
